

RAFFLES

IAW AFI 34- 223, Private Organizations (PO) Program, para 10.16: Those POs which are composed primarily of DoD personnel or their family members may conduct fundraising raffles on an Air Force installation on an occasional, infrequent basis (no more than twice a year) when authorized by 99 FSS/CC (delegated by 99 ABW/CC to 99 MSG/CC to 99 FSS/CC).

Not Authorized:

- ❖ 10.16.2. Raise money for local or national groups such as a regional or national Heart or Cancer Association whose funds would not benefit primarily DoD personnel or their family members
- ❖ 10.16.2.2. Raise funds for purely social, recreational, or entertainment purposes which benefit only individual PO members and/or their family members, such as to underwrite the cost of a weekend ski trip, a sight-seeing tour, or a shopping excursion
- ❖ 10.16.4. Cannot be conducted in the workplace
- ❖ 10.16.5. Cannot be conducted by military members or civilian employees during their duty time
- ❖ 10.16.5. Military members may not conduct raffles while in uniform at any time

Process:

- ❖ Submit requests via email to 99 FSS/FSRBL (Banking)
- ❖ Include responses to the following:
 - Name of Private Organization
 - DoD Charity proceeds earned from the raffle will go to
 - Identify purpose for which funds are raised
 - Intended beneficiaries of the proceeds
 - How will the PO ensure the proceeds are used only for that purpose and those beneficiaries?
 - Where will tickets/chances be sold?
 - Time frame for selling tickets/chances (i.e., 1-14 Mar)
- ❖ 10.16, last paragraph, 99 FSS/FSRBL forwards to USAFWC/JA for review

State of Nevada Gaming Control Board Statue for Lotteries (also applies to Raffles):

- ❖ No application to the board is required if the following is met:

NRS 462.130 says that a charitable organization may operate a charitable lottery if the total value of the prizes offered in the charitable lottery does not exceed \$2,500 and (a) the organization operates no more than two charitable lotteries per calendar year; or (b) The tickets or chances for the charitable lottery are sold only to members of the organization, and to guests of those members while attending a special event sponsored by the organization, and the total value of all the prizes offered in charitable lotteries operated by the organization during the same calendar year does not exceed \$15,000.
